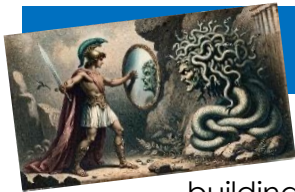

ENGLISH

MATHS



This term, we will complete our learning on division before undergoing learning in fractions, and decimals. As part of this, we will explore mental and written methods to solve problems using the four operations linked to fractions and decimals.
