ENGLISH

In English, we will be reading Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo inspired by our history topics of Anglo-Saxons. We will create a hero, a monster and write our own myths. Our grammar focus will be learning about relative clauses, powerful verbs and adverbial phrases of manner.

MATHS



This term we will be deepening our understanding of Multiplication and Division, looking at multiplying and dividing larger numbers and using formal written methods. We will also be learning about measures of time and working out the duration of events on a timetable. Throughout this term, we will be continuing to learn all our times tables ahead of the Multiplication Check in June.

SCIENCE



We are going to be exploring states of matter this term in science. We will be exploring solids, liquids, and gases and how heating and cooling materials can allow them to change state. We will be conducting experiments to understand the processes of evaporation and condensation ready for our 'Water Cycle' topic next term.

HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY



This term, we will be looking at the governance of Britain after the Anglo Saxons arrived. Later in the term we will be exploring the burial site at Sutton Hoo, using artefacts that were found to form opinions about which Anglo Saxon may have been buried there.

In geography, we will be exploring geographical location and how it relates to climate and time zones. We will look at mapping skills including grid referencing and build on our knowledge of lines of longitude and latitude from last term.

Art



This half term we will be exploring art with an environmental theme, looking to English artist Oenone Hammersley for inspiration. We will be using the mediums of pencil and pastels to practice our observational drawing skills and learning the skill of underpainting.
