Book Recommendation

Albert class have been reading 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll. Set in 1941, after months of bombing raids in London, twelve Year old Olive and her little brother Cliff are evacuated to the Devon coast. The only person with two spare beds is Mr Ephraim, the local lighthouse keeper but he's not used to company and he certainly doesn't want any evacuees. Desperate to be helpful, Olive becomes his post-girl, delivering messages to the villages, which she imagines as "letters", however, she harbors a personal secret: her older sister Sukie went missing during an air raid. Olive discovers a mysterious coded note that seems to link Sukie to Devon and to a situation, prompting her to unravel the mystery while navigating the challenges of wartime evacuation.
