It has been another positive and productive week across the school, with plenty of opportunities for children to learn both in and out of the classroom.



On Monday, Willows Class visited the London Transport Museum, where they explored the history of transport in the capital and took part in activities that brought their learning to life. The visit provided a fantastic opportunity to deepen their understanding of how London has changed over time, and the children represented the school brilliantly throughout the day.

You may have noticed a change to our Serenity Circle area this week, where the existing shrubbery has been removed. This is the first step in developing the space to make it more accessible for children in Rowan Wood from September. In assembly on Tuesday, I spoke to all children about these changes and the importance of inclusion and respect. This was an inspiring experience for the children and has given them a brilliant model as they continue preparing for their own end of year performance. We are already looking forward to seeing their hard work come together on stage.

Looking ahead, our Year 1 children will take part in the Phonics Screening Check next week. The children have worked exceptionally hard throughout the year to develop their reading skills, and we are already very proud of the progress they have made.

Thank you to those who were able to attend the [PIA](#) meeting on Wednesday morning. There was a real sense of excitement as plans continue to develop for our Summer Fair, which will take place on Thursday 2nd July. We look forward to sharing further details with you soon.

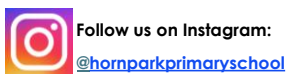
