

Weekly Newsletter 3rd March 2023

Over the last two weeks, children across Key Stage 2 have taken part in their first 'MyBnk' sessions. MyBnk's mission is to bring financial education and enterprise to life for young people. Their sessions use real life case studies, interactive resources and games to enable young people to gain practical skills like budgeting.

On Tuesday, we held an online safety workshop. Parents and carers had the opportunity to watch part of a year 6 PSHE lesson linked to this area of the curriculum. 
