Back in school we also had lots of exciting this going on.

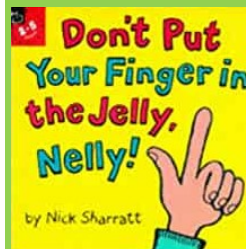
