#### **LITERACY**

This half-term in Literacy, we will be exploring various Traditional Tales. The children will be developing their comprehension skills as well as questioning and role play.

We will also begin our phonics learning, starting with recognising environmental sounds in listening walks.

# UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORLD

Our focus this term will be celebrating the similarities and differences between children in the class and discussing how we are all unique. We will discuss different cultures and share our own experiences, linking to Black History Month.

We will also use our senses to explore forest school during our weekly sessions looking for changes within weather and seasons.

# Personal, Social Development

Horn Park follows a 'values-based education'. Throughout the half term we will spend time embedding these within our setting. Our school values are: respect, positivity, unity, honesty, perseverance and kindness.

Within Nursery this term we are focusing on building positive relationships with both children and staff as well as beginning to explore our own feelings.

#### **MATHS**

In Maths, we will be learning to sort and match objects by their similarities and differences whilst exploring different resources.

From this we will then begin to investigate numbers to 3 thinking about their composition and how to subitise.

# PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

This half term we will be developing our coordination and movements by playing different games in our outside area and joining in with dance and movement sessions during circle time. We will also build on our fine motor skills with the use of small equipment.

We will steadily build on our own confidence with daily routines such getting dressed independently.

Key dates – 12<sup>th</sup> September, 9-9.30 – Meet the teacher 3<sup>rd</sup> October, 9-10 – Reading workshop


### **HOME LEARNING**

Draw your favourite characters from the Traditional Tales that we have learnt in class. You could even act them out!




Share and read a book every day and talk about the story.
