ENGLISH

To start this term, we will be using the famous pictures from The Mysteries of Harris Burdick to explore genre and the power of vocabulary to write setting descriptions. Later in the term, we will be focusing on a short story written based on one of the pictures to develop our knowledge of subordination and adverbs. We will finish the term by writing a letter to the owners of the British History Museum to thank them for the great Ancient Egyptian history trip we will be going on next month.

MATHS



This term, to start off with we will be looking at length and perimeter. This will include measuring in metres, centimetres, and millilitres. We will then start something brand new - fractions! We will be learning all about unit and non-unit fractions, how we can tell whether one fraction is greater or less than another and finding fractions of amounts. We will then start to learn about mass and capacity. Our times table for this term is the 8 times table.

SCIENCE

all about animals including humans. We will begin this topic by understanding herbivores, carnivores, and omnivores. This learning will include exploring bone functions and our muscles and joints. At the end of our topic, we will be recapping prior learning focusing on healthy eating and the eatwell plates.

HISTORY & **GEOGRAPHY**

This half term, we will be continuing to look at Egyptians in History and the influence of the River Thames in Geography. We will delve deeper into the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb in the Valley of the Kings, and asking whether Howard Carter was a thief or a hero for what he did. We will be looking at how the River Thames is used for transport and trade and the different ways in which we cross the river as well as the impact of pollution.
