

# Weekly Newsletter: 7th June 2024

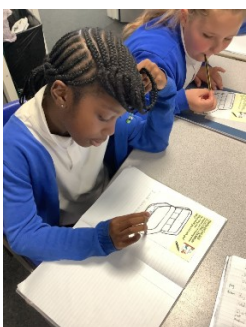


Dear parents and carers,
